## Village of Fisher Regular Board of Trustees Meeting 14 June 2018

The Regular Board of Trustees meeting was held on 14 June 2018 at 6:00 p.m. at the Community Center. Roll call: Deer-present, Estes-absent, Henderson-present, Ponton-present, Seidelman-present, Spaulding-present, Bayler-present.

Motion by Henderson,  $2^{nd}$  by Seidelman to approve the agenda tabling #16 Approve TIF Redevelopment Agreement with Mike Bateman for building demolition at 418 N . First Street NTE \$20,000.00 until July meeting. Voice vote: all yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Seidelman, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Spaulding to approve the previous meeting minutes. Voice vote: all yes. Motion carried.

**Public Comments:** Judy Cagle questioned if the tornado sirens were functioning. She was informed that yes they are functioning. Testing that was done on the first Tuesday of the month resulted in a glitch in the system in which none of the sirens sounded in Champaign County. She also questioned seatbelts in golf carts. Village President Bayler stated that it is not a requirement that golf carts have seatbelts.

Luke Esteppe with Illinois American Water thanked Jeremy for all his work prior and post close on the water/wastewater sale and presented him with a plaque for his work.

Nick Shepherd had some questions about the rules and regulations for the mobile home park. Village President Bayler stated that the Ordinance for the Village will piggy back off of the State Ordinance but will have more local control. This will be discussed later in the meeting.

Motion by Deer, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Seidelman to approve pay application No. 3 for North Side Storm Sewer Improvement Phase 2 to Dirtworks Trucking & Excavating not to exceed \$11,215.16. Roll call vote: Spaulding-yes, Deer-yes, Henderson-yes, Ponton-yes, Seidelman-yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Ponton, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Seidelman to authorize the bid for purchase of a new police squad vehicle to Morrow Brothers not to exceed \$37,890.00. Roll call vote: Deer-yes, Henderson-yes, Ponton-yes, Seidelman-yes, Spaulding-yes. Motion carried. Delivery will be in approximately 12 weeks.

Motion by Seidelman, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Spaulding to approve the quote from Illini Fire Service for anti-freeze replacement and piping repairs to Community Center fire suppression system NTE \$1,800.00. Roll call vote: Deer-yes, Ponton-yes, Seidelman-yes, Spaulding-yes, Henderson-yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Henderson, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Deer to award the bid to Illiana Construction for 2018 MFT street maintenance program not to exceed \$36,395.60. Roll call vote: Seidelman-yes, Spaulding-yes, Henderson-yes, Deer-yes, Ponton-yes. Motion carried.

The playground equipment at Lammle Park is needing updated and/or replaced. Trustee Seidelman will look through the choices and bring back some ideas to the Board. The Board was in agreement to set the budget to around \$25,000.00.

First Street, Fisher, Illinois pursuant to a Commercial Real Estate Sales Contract as presented and authorize the President to execute it on behalf of the Village and to take such action and expend such funds as is

necessary to consummate the terms of the contract. Roll call vote: Spaulding-yes, Deer-yes, Ponton-yes,
