Motion by Seidelman, 2nd by Deer to approve the agenda. Voice Vote: all yes. Motion carried.

Village Presidents Report: President Bayler had a conference call with the Public Health Department. They informed President Bayler that if the Village would have a positive COVID test then the Health Department would take over and the Village would not need to do anything. Anyone working can be tested for free. As of this meeting there are no positive COVID tests in Fisher.

There has been 25 million dollars issued for shovel ready projects. The Village is putting in for the projects on Third Street and the rest of First Street.

The Village of Fisher along with surrounding towns and Senator Chapin Rose will be submitting a letter to Governor Pritzker asking for a different pace to reopen.

The Village is able to purchase 2 garbage cans from DUCE to be placed around the pond in Heritage. Jim Vestal will be spraying the dandelions around the pond in Heritage, the parks and the Village Hall. The board was in agreement to leave the health insurance unchanged.
